Dear Ms. Schou,

the last days I talked with Barry Reville from the Australian Government and John Vetter from ORICA.

The timetable regarding the proposed application concerning the transport of HCB-waste to Schleswig-Holstein is as follows:

- Issue of application incl. DRR mid of January 2009
- around 20th January information of our Parliament in Schleswig-Holstein
- around 25th January (voluntary) public meeting in Brunsbüttel
- mid/end February 2009 decision of our competent authority.

As Mr. Vetter told me, you expect his application at the end of this month. Is this correct ? According Regulation (EC) No 1013/2006 you have to decide within 30 days. Will you than make your decision before the application for Schleswig-Holstein will be issued ? And how is the general situation in Denmark ? For us it is very important to be well informed about your decision-making process. I guess the other way round it's the same.

So please let us keep entouched according the following steps in this case.

Dear Ms. Schou,

this morning Dr. Barry Reville and Mr. Damien Hall from the Australien Government, Dept. of the Environment and Water Resources were here in Kiel and we discussed the proposed export and final disposal of HCB waste from Australia to Brunsbüttel in Schleswig-Holstein, Germany. In accordance with the German Constitution and environmental legislation the competent authority for the notification of the above mentioned export is the government in Schleswig-Holstein. Dr. Reville reported from his visit in Copenhagen and pointed out that a part of the HCB waste is proposed to be burned in Nyborg. For that reason I suggest we should handle this matter in close cooperation and keep us informed about any developments. Today we came along with our Australien colleagues that after the first unsuccessful application of Orica company the Australien Government will pass to us a draft of the proposed export including a detailed description why Australia cannot reasonably acquire the technical capacity and the necessary facilities in order to dispose of the waste in an environmentally sound matter (Art. 41 para. 3 Regulation (EC) No 1013/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 14 June 2006 on shipments of waste).
