Ahmed currently serves as Executive President of the Syrian Democratic Council (SDC), a coalition of multiethnic organizations representing the peoples of the federal region of northern Syria. Ahmed is the most recognizable and central figure for the regional authority of the most stable, peaceful region of Syria. The SDC is the political arm of the Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF), which has been allied with the United States Armed Forces in the struggle against ISIS and global terrorism. Ahmed has appeared on many TV news programs, in publications such as The Washington Post and Foreign Policy Magazine, and has authored op-eds in The New York Times and other publications.
